2003/2004 has been another excellent year for the branch, with good attendance at most meetings. We believe the topics covered have been of great interest, and the speakers have been excellent.

This year's program has seen a wide range of topics from Computer Restoration and Internet Archiving, through to Quantum computing. The Christmas lecture followed our traditions of filling the hall, with Steve Grand introducing his first developmental robot orang-utan, Lucy, and talking about how to create artificial life in 10 easy steps! Next month, our annual trip takes us to Bletchley Park, the home of the ENIGMA machine.

Our Branch website has also gone from strength to strength. Adrian Walmsley has, this year, taken over and maintained the site. He has made considerable improvements to the interface and the content. Next year will see yet more changes, as we move to a new host and Adrian develops new features to provide more dynamic content.

The largest of these is in the membership structure and the introduction, from the 1st May, of new post nominal letters CITP (Chartered IT Professional) for all existing full members of the society. Under the new scheme, anyone can become full MBCS members of the society with relevant experience and the recommendation of an existing chartered member.
